## Summary

Following inspection activity in the 2022-2023 academic year, the BSc dental technology programme at the University of Bolton were given actions to address within a specified timeframe. Progress monitoring has been undertaken by the EQA team to review what improvements have been made, to ensure that the actions outlined in the report have been appropriately addressed.

In December 2023, the University of Bolton, provided information regarding what progress had been made against the report actions. Education associates were not required, and the information was reviewed by the Education Quality Assurance team.

Three Requirements have been addressed and therefore changed from Partly Met to Met. There are six Requirements that need additional follow up in March 2024.
